

Office of the Official Receiver In Insolvency

The Office of the Official Receiver In Insolvency is established under the Insolvency Act, 2015. The office is a department under the Business Registration Service and is governed by the Insolvency Act, 2015 and its Regulations.

The roles of the department entail:

- Receiving, approving and issuing insolvency licenses to qualified insolvency practitioners;
- Supervising insolvency practitioners in matters of bankruptcy of natural persons/ alternative to bankruptcy, liquidation and administration of insolvent companies;
- Administration of insolvent deceased estate; act as interim in respect of debtors property; investigating the conduct of the debtor and reporting to court; and
- Verifying proofs, petitions, affidavits administered under the insolvency act; advertising the bankruptcy orders and reporting to the creditors of any voluntary arrangement which the debtor/company may have made with respect to liquidating the debts among others.

Insolvency Act Amendments

Distressed companies now have 30 days pre-insolvency moratorium period to seek and consider options for rescue

A holder of a floating charge can now apply to court to challenge a distribution to unsecured creditors where the effects unfairly harms its interests.

These amendments increase the recovery rate and reduce the time taken to resolve insolvency cases.
